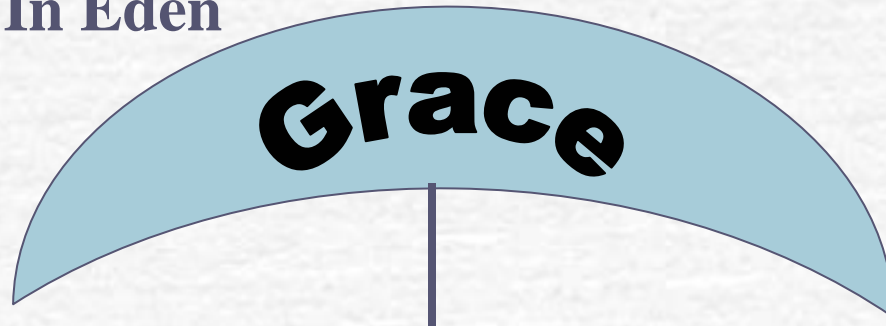
False Definitions of Grace

Separated From God

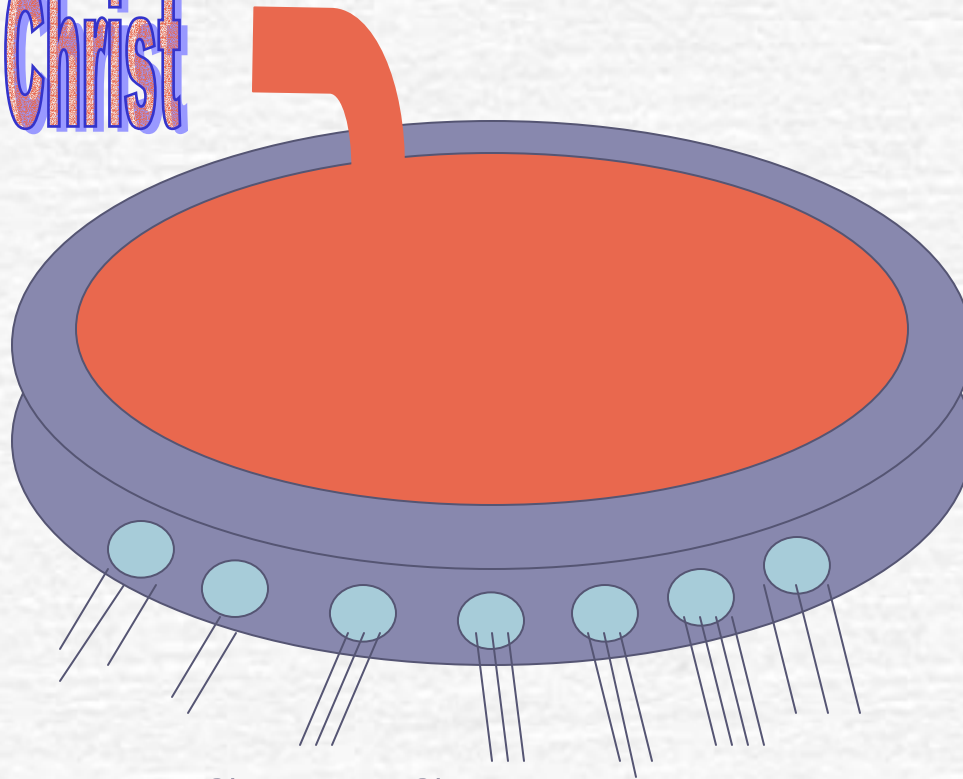

- ☞ **Unconditional Election**
 - No (Acts 10:34,35)
- ☞ **Limited Atonement**
 - No (Titus 2:11)
- ☞ **Irresistible Grace**
 - No (2 Cor. 6:1)
- ☞ **Perseverance of the Saints**
 - No (Gal. 5:4)
