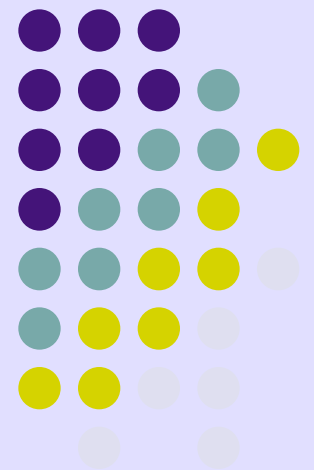
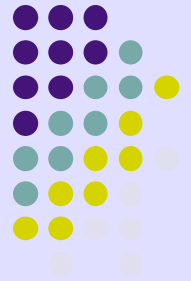


Neglect So Great a Salvation?

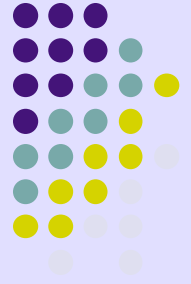


The Writer Warns



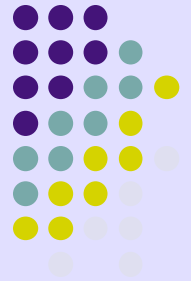
- That the things we have heard can drift away.
- Not to neglect So Great A Salvation (Heb. 2:1-4)
 - We neglect by failing to worship (Acts 20:7)
 - By neglecting our study of the scriptures (2 Tim. 2:15)
 - By neglecting to pray (1 Thess. 5:17)
 - By letting the world determine our morals (Eph. 5:11; 1 Tim. 2:9-10)
 - By failing to give (1 Cor. 16:2)

Why is Our Salvation so Great?



- Because of the plan (Eph. 1:3-14)
- Because of its promises (Eph. 1:3)
- Because of its authenticity (Heb. 2:3-4)
 - First spoken by the Lord
 - Confirmed by signs and wonders
- Because it allows us to escape the consequences of sin (Heb. 2:2-3a, 10:26-31)

- Heb. 6:9-12
 - But, beloved, we are confident of better things concerning you, yes, things that accompany salvation, though we speak in this manner.
 - For God is not unjust to forget your work and labor of love which you have shown toward His name, in that you have ministered to the saints, and do minister.
